## <u>Head Teacher Message</u>


Dear Parents and Carers,

## <u>Fidget Toys</u>-

It has come to our attention that we have an increasing number of children bringing in toys from home telling us they are fidget toys.

Whilst we understand that fidget toys can be a useful tool for some children, we would like remind you that children should only have a fidget toy in school if they have an identified need for one and have an agreed plan in place to use this as a reasonable adjustment. In such cases, we ask for children to only use a school provided fidget toy which should remain in the classroom. Children should not bring fidget toys from home.


