Sports Premium Grant Planning 2022-2023

Following on from the successful Olympic Games held in London in 2012, each year the Government allocate funding directly to primary schools to support the provision of quality PE and sport. Each school receives a lump sum of £16000 plus an extra £10 per pupil each year. At Coates Way this amounts to approximately £18000 per year. The money is ring-fenced to ensure PE and sport is at the heart of school life to raise achievement for all young pupils.
