As we enter into the new school year, the following articles in the newsletter are reminders of procedures and policies.



A new year serves as a good time to remind parents and carers of our policy regarding behaviour for all members of the school community. After School Club

You may remember that I wrote to parents last term about our intention to increase our wrap around care provision. Those parents who expressed an interest were sent registration forms. House Captains

Today in assembly, I spoke to the children about the renaming of the school houses. We would like the children to come up with new names for these four houses. If your child chooses to take part they will make a small presentation to their class and each class will vote for the name of the house they like best, it will then proceed to a whole school vote. I have told the children the name of the house must be the name of someone alive or dead who they feel have shown through their work or actions qualities that are important to us today.

Once the names for the school houses are decided, we will elect school house captains and vice captains. They will have several roles throughout the year.

The whole process links in with Democracy which is one of the British Values we have been studying with the children.



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
