VIP Questions

An adult could ask you one or two of these VIP questions from VIPER to help you to talk about the book you are reading:

V - Vocabulary

Find and explain the meaning of words in context

- What does ... mean? What other word (synonym) could the author have used that means the same?
- Which key word tells you about the character, the setting or the mood?
- Find one word in the text which means ...
- Find the word that is closest in meaning to ...

I - Infer

Make and justify inferences using evidence from the text.

- How do these words make the reader feel?
- What voice might these characters use?
- What was ... thinking when...?
- Who is telling the story?

P - Predict

Predict what might happen from the details given and implied

- What is happening now? What happened before this?
- What will happen after?
